33 Energy to discuss the repair of the Amphitheater electric box. Many training opportunities are
34 available to the Commissioners through the MML (Michigan Municipal League) and MAP
35 (Michigan Association of Planners). Wiederhold will begin working on the 2020-2021 budget
36 with department heads this month.

37 **City Attorney** – Stout reported that he received the recorded DDA property Quit Claim Deeds
38 that were filed with the Genesee County Register of Deeds last month and handed them to
39 Wiederhold.

40 **City Treasurer-** reported that he has enrolled Deputy Treasurer, Kelly Sproul in the 2020
41 Treasurer’s Basic Training Institute.

42 **Chief of Police** – reported that an Officer has been on workman’s compensation since January
43 22, 2019, approaching the 1-year anniversary. The City Police Department is a 24/7 station and
44 has been operating for almost a year now with only two full-time officers. The city needs to
45 consider hiring a fourth full-time officer to keep the PD at full service. Last year the Police
46 Department received 1033 calls for service, and 232 arrests, not including self-initiated public
47 safety responses. Zecman would like to implement a program called “Hope, Not Handcuffs”
48 where a drug-dependent individual can voluntarily turn in their narcotics without legal
49 repercussion. Additionally, the department will be training for Narcan, this will enable officers to
50 carry in the police units and administer the drug if and when necessary to save a life.
