



NEIGHBORHOOD STREET IMPROVEMENTS

Work to Begin the Week Starting Monday, July 8, 2019

Eastern Asphalt was awarded a \$359,591.40 bid for the City's 2019 Neighborhood Street Improvements Program to include the crush/ shape of the one block sections of Campbell Street and Curry Street immediately west of North Mill Street and the mill and resurface of Rogers Lodge Drive. This Program will be financed, in part, with proceeds of a Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy Scrap Tire Market Development Grant award of up to \$193,751.




CLIO CITY PARK TRAILHEAD AND RESTROOMS

Superior Contracting was awarded a \$447,109 bid for the City's Clio City Park Trailhead and Restrooms project with work to begin later this summer and substantially completed on or before October 25, 2019. The project will be financed, in part, with proceeds of Michigan Department of Natural Resources Natural Resources Trust Fund grant award of up to \$262,500.

Site improvements include an improved graded walkway and serpentine ramp descending from a new circular vehicular parking area to the City's trail running along the Pine Run Creek and a new restroom facility. The restroom facility will feature three heated unisex restrooms available for public use throughout the year.

The City will install three security cameras panning the improvements and the adjoining playscape immediately following the completion of this project.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Monitoring Requirements Not Met for the City of Clio

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. We did not complete all monitoring or testing for water quality parameters and, therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time. However, this violation **does not** pose a threat to your supply's water.

What should I do? There is nothing you need to do at this time. This is not an emergency. You do not need to boil water or use an alternative source of water at this time. Even though this is not an emergency, as our customer, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct the situation.

The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for, how often we are supposed to sample for these contaminants, how many samples we are supposed to take, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date we will collect follow-up samples.

What happened? What is being done? We inadvertently missed taking all of the required samples within this required sampling period. We will continue to work with the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes & Energy to resolve issues as quickly as possible.
