45 **City Administrator** – Wiederhold reported budget amendments regarding adding Clarion Street  
46 which will cost \$58 to \$64K to resurface street. Thank you to Commissioner Williams for  
47 alerting him to the inoperable sirens. The sirens have been fixed. Wiederhold reported on the  
48 complaints on 701 N. Mill Street being vacant for a year. He will send a letter requesting right of  
49 entry.

1 **City Attorney** – USDA is all set for closing this week. Stout has court this week for 200 E.  
2 Vienna Street.

3 **Chief of Police** – reported on Rite Aid and RPM receiving citations for spilling hazardous waste.  
4 The Fire Department was able to track and connect to Rite Aid Pharmacy. Camp 911 was  
5 successful as the event was held in the city park which resulted in signing up two new recruits.  
6 Regarding the bio-hazardous waste complaint, Chief visited Dr. Paul Racine with Vienna  
7 Dentistry. Dr. Paul Racine was able to provide the OSHA requirements that have been met and in  
8 compliance by his office. Explorer group will meet next week. Chief hopes to have it up and  
9 running next year.

11 **City Engineer**- the M-57/ Vienna Road project is complete, just waiting to be paved. Hopefully,  
12 before the Firemen’s Homecoming parade.

13 **DPS Superintendent**- thank you for the dump truck, it is very nice.

14 **Clerk** – reported the she is coordinating with the County and Vienna Township the new election  
15 equipment delivery and disposal of the old election equipment. Kingston will be leaving

31 the months, April through November. The Homecoming parade is this Thursday.

32 **Mayor Pro Tem Bare**- attended the new Vienna Farmers Market along with State  
33 Representative Pam Faris this past Saturday. Parks and Rec is discussing the ice rink idea moving  
34 forward once again. Bare attended Small Cities, where speaker Bobby Walton reported that the  
35 businesses sponsor and completely pay their Fireworks. Kudos for State Representative Pam  
36 Faris for going to bat for the city regarding the MNRTF grants naming the City of Clio as a  
37 recipient for the park bathroom project. The Fire Authority has been testing new pagers and  
38 walkie-talkies to be ordered soon. No Library board meeting. Judy Lee died of cancer.
