3 **City Administrator** – reported that he will be requesting bids for North and South Mill Streets
4 road striping. Wiederhold received the prestigious 2018 recognition from the Governmental
5 Finance Officers Association (GFOA). Certification of Achievement for Excellence in Financial
6 Reporting. Attorney Peter Doerr has requested by FOIA process, proof of publications for older
7 Zoning Ordinances. The recent Traffic Control orders were triggered by a faded Palmer Street
8 sign, which was then referred to DPS Superintendent, Arnold Brown and Police Chief, Rick
9 Witham. Additionally, Wiederhold reported that the Commission will be receiving the City Park
10 Trailhead Project and Restroom Improvement bid recommendation for consideration at their next
11 Commission meeting June 17, 2019.

13 Personal Property taxes be expunged from the city’s records. The new Judge Pickell signed the
